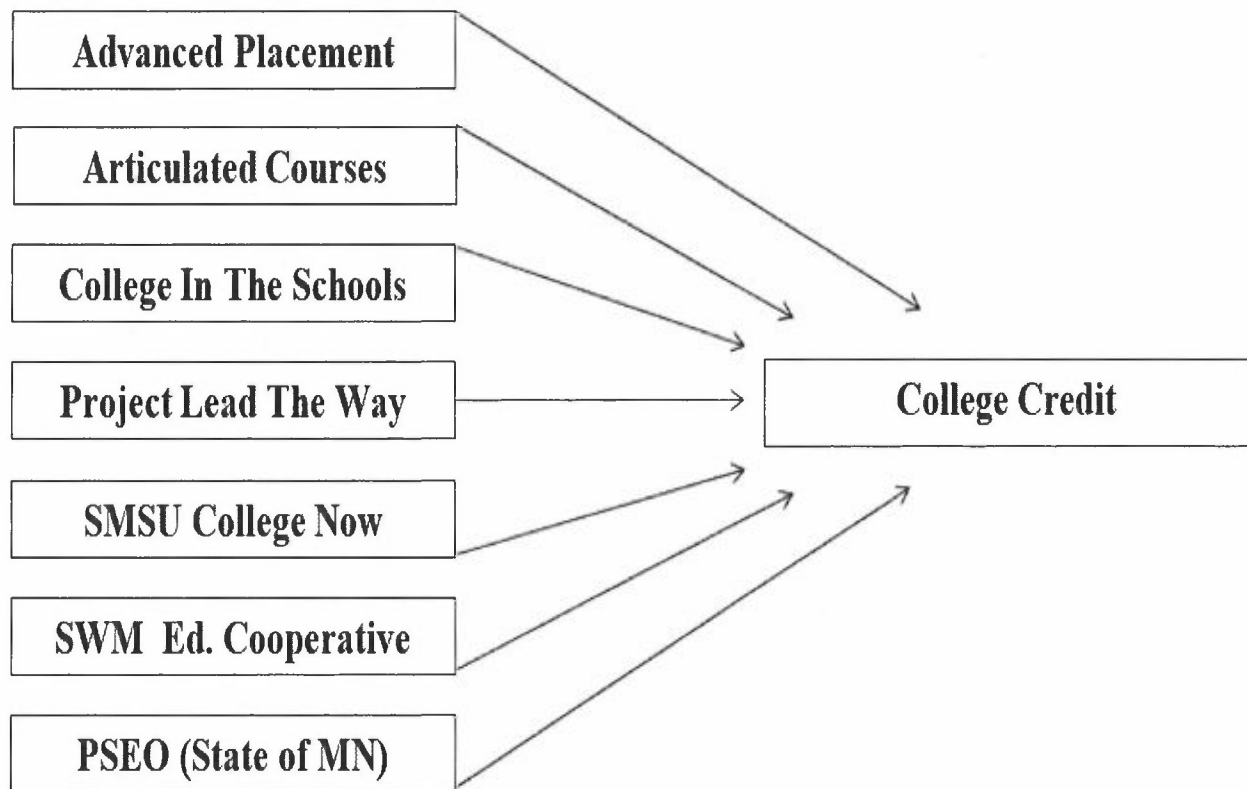


Seven Ways to earn College Credit (credits beyond high school)



Post-Secondary Credit Opportunities

College credits offered on campus at Waconia High School

This document outlines six categories whereby students may earn college credits without leaving Waconia High School. Please see the Waconia High School Registration Handbook for course descriptions; meet with your high school counselor, or visit the listed websites for program details. Course offerings are dependent upon student registration.

I. Advanced Placement Courses

By taking AP courses, you may earn college credit if you take an AP exam at the end of the course AND typically earn a score of at least three (3) or higher on a scale of one (1) to five (5). Colleges may award credit or advanced academic standing based on your score and completion of the course.

II. Articulated Courses

What is PSEO?

This program allows sophomores, juniors and seniors the opportunity to enroll full-time or part-time at a postsecondary institution for high school and college credit. Colleges offer on-campus or online courses. It is up to the student to determine which option best fits their academic needs. Postsecondary institutions are not allowed to charge PSEO students for tuition, textbooks or support services. Students may be charged for equipment that becomes their property when the course or program is completed. Room and board are not covered under the PSEO program. Transportation assistance may be available to qualifying students who participate in on campus courses.

Where can students attend?

Eligible institutions include the U of M (all branches), all state universities, community and technical colleges, and some private two year and four year institutions. Each institution has a set of entrance and program requirements. To be eligible, a 10th-grade student must have met the proficiency level of “meets or exceeds” on the 8th-grade MCA reading test. If the student did not take the MCA, another reading assessment accepted by the enrolling postsecondary institution can be substituted. Sophomore students are only allowed to enroll in one Career and Technical Education course to start. If a student earns at least a C in that course, they may take additional courses. Interested and eligible 11th- and 12th-grade students should contact the postsecondary institution to find out their eligibility requirements. Some colleges have placement exams and specific application deadlines. It is up to the individual student to be sure they are meeting all of the requirements needed to apply and enroll.

PSEO grading

Students should start their planning early. The student is expected to be a responsible and independent learner. When selecting courses, it is the **student’s responsibility** for making sure they are fulfilling their high school requirements. WHS does not have access to the student’s college attendance and grade in progress. **PSEO courses are included in figuring rank and GPA, this includes incompletes, withdrawals and failures.** A student’s high school diploma is held until grades are received at WHS. Students will be allowed to participate in the ceremony if they are in good academic standing.

A PSEO student is allowed to participate in high school activities and events. The student will also receive high school credit for each college course they are registered for. The following is the credit conversion.

5 college credits= 3.33 WHS credits
4 college credits= 2.67 WHS credits
3 college credits= 2.0 WHS credits
2 college credits= 1.33 WHS credits
1 college credit= .67 WHS credit

When transferring credits under the PSEO program, it is up to the transfer rules of that institution. It is recommended that students contact those institutions to verify their college credits will transfer after high school.

Steps to follow if interested in participating in PSEO:

1. Parent and student need to make an appointment to meet with Mrs. Alger (last names A-H) or Mrs. Henn (last names I-Z), in the high school guidance office prior to **May 15, 2020**. The guidance office is open from 7:30 am until 3:00 pm. Please call 952-442-0676 or email to lalger@isd110.org or dhenn@isd110.org to schedule an appointment. At this meeting, the following things will occur: discuss graduation plans (including credit checks) and the necessary college and state paperwork will be completed.
2. Once the college receives the material, they will notify you of your acceptance or denial. Once accepted, there will be a PSEO student orientation and registration that the college requires be completed. Please follow the directions from the college.
3. Once the student has registered and attended orientation, the student must provide a copy of their college schedule to Mrs. Alger or Mrs. Henn prior to the start of school. This information is used to ensure credits are being met for graduation, to adjust the high school schedule and to provide documentation of enrollment.
